

ROTC research awards

Description of the awards

Support is available to pay ROTC Cadets and Midshipmen to participate in research with MSEE URA principal investigators, either during the academic year or during the summer. Awards of up to \$4500 are available, to be paid in accordance with the student's university's hourly wage rates and policies.

Who is eligible

Candidates must be enrolled as an ROTC Cadet or Midshipman at an MSEE URA institution, and have their application sponsored by an MSEE URA principal investigator.

How to apply

Compile the attached application and email it to mseeura@jhu.edu.

Application deadline

Applications will be accepted on an ongoing basis. It may take up to three months for application review and a subaward to be issued to the student's institution.

Reporting requirement and speaking opportunity

Recipients will be required to submit a brief report at the end of the award period describing the outcome of the research. Recipients will be invited to present their results at either the MSEE URA Annual Meeting or the MSEE URA Student Symposium.
